Fredrick Prigien an alien, and reports himself for NATURALIZATION,  
 and being duly sworn on oath declares that he is a native of Berthausfeld, Germany  
 aged about 22 years, and owes allegiance to George August  
 that he emigrated thence, embarked at Haffer and arrived at New York  
 in the United States on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of September, A. D., 1847; and that it is bona  
 fide his intention to reside in and become A CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES, and to renounce forever ALL ALLEGIANCE  
 AND FIDELITY to every Foreign Prince, Potentate, State or Sovereignty whatever; and particularly to  
George August whom he was heretofore a subject  
 Sworn and subscribed the first day of November, 1852 Fredrick Prigien

County & Circuit of Russell at the Court  
house in Owensboro' on Friday the  
25<sup>th</sup> day of May 1829. Present the  
Hon<sup>ble</sup> Mr. Calhoun Judge of said Court.

" This day came John T. Hutchinson  
personally in Court, and swore that he came to  
the United States on or about the 9<sup>th</sup> day of  
April 1827, from Scotland, that it was  
bona fide his intention to become a citizen  
of the United States, and to renounce forever  
his allegiance to and fidelity to any foreign Prince  
Potentate, State or Sovereignty whatever, and  
particularly Victoria Queen of England Scotland  
and Wales, whom he is a citizen or  
subject, which is ordered to be certified "
