"Guy," as he was known to all, was born on Feb. 14, 1919, delivered by his grandfather, Dr. P.N. Hoover, at home in Boonville, Ind. As a boy, Guy often accompanied his father, Dr. J. Guy Hoover Sr., and his grandfather on their rounds on house calls all over Warrick County. Thus was born his desire to be a doctor.

A 1936 graduate of Boonville High School, he lettered in football, wrestling, boxing and basketball. His choice of No. 13 for his athletic jerseys was indicative of his independent spirit.
