

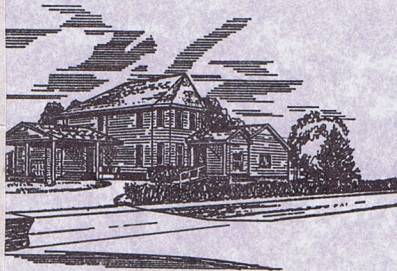

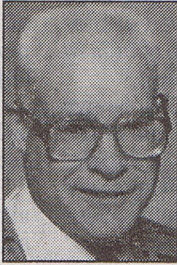

"What they did was give him a regular Coke. He caught on all right, but he paid his part. He was a good sport."

"He was one of the top bowlers in the 1950s and 1960s," said Russ Neathery. "I bowled with him for about 20 years. He was one of the nicest fellows you'd ever meet."

He was a member of Fendrich Golf Course Men's Club. He had two holes in one and once shot his own age.

"He hit one hole in one with a 4 iron at No. 8, at Fendrich," said Dave Shellhase, a 20-year golfing buddy. "We were happy for him. It's great when one goes in.

"He went to Tell City every year, for the Sweizer Fest. He won a set of golf clubs there, one year. He was left handed, and he was a great chipper putter."
