As our weather is getting nicer all the time, I want to remind you to visit cemeteries where you have family buried and check on the condition of the gravestones.

A few tips for cemetery visits:

- *Carry a cemetery kit in your vehicle. In your kit you can include scissors or clippers, a small broom, trash bags, a small soft brush, garden gloves, a spray bottle with water, and a trowel if you have a flower vase attached.
- *You may also want to carry bug spray and sunscreen. Check for ticks as soon as possible.
- *Observe each gravestone for any cracks or problems.
- *Clean off any grass and dirt that has collected over the winter.
- *Keep your gravestones clean and decorated.
- *Some times that are nice to visit are:

Memorial Day (formerly known as Decoration Day)

Birthdays or anniversaries of your family

Fourth of July for Veterans (decorate with flags or red, white, & blue)

*Make sure that you have a good picture of the gravestone and surrounding cemetery for your Family Tree program and also upload to Find a Grave or Billion Graves. You can also share those pics to Ancestry.com or My Heritage.
